Information:

- Nominations must be received by June 1, 2015. Nominators will receive confirmation of nomination receipt by email, unless other means is requested.
- Nominees must be residents of Alberta at the time of nomination, or information be provided for students or workers temporarily outside the province about residency and confirming when she will return to Alberta
- At least ONE letter of support from a person other than the nominator must be provided. A maximum of three letters are acceptable.
- Up to **five pages of additional information** (certificates, photos, media coverage, etc.) may be included with a nomination to support the information in the form. Do NOT send original materials-- clear copies only.
- Decisions will be based entirely on the package of information submitted and no additional input will be accepted after the nomination deadline.
- Nominees selected to be award recipients will be asked to provide a photo as a .jpg file.
- There is no age restriction on nominees, but post-humus nominations are not accepted.
- Nominations may be submitted electronically to jimgurnett@yahoo.ca or by mail to Daughters of the Year at 710-10150-100 Street, Edmonton AB T5J 0P6.
- All nominees are invited to attend an August 29 event in Edmonton at which the award recipients will be recognized.

- Decisions are made by a jury that operates independently of Daughters Day.
